Day 2: Perth to Margaret River

Distance: 284 Kms **Time:** 3 Hours 2 Minutes

- **Morning:** Spend some of the time taking a stroll around Kings Park and Botanic Garden. The Garden overlooks the Perth central business district and is a combination of bushland, botanical gardens and grassed areas for you to enjoy.
- **Afternoon:** Now it's time to leave Perth behind and head towards Margaret River.
- **Evening:** Wind up your first day on the road with a tour of Lake Cave, which is just a short drive from Margaret River. This stunning natural landmark is home to a tranquil lake located in a pristine chamber beneath a karri forest.
- **Where to stay:** Margaret River Tourist Park. 44 Station Road, Margaret River WA 6285.

Day 1: Perth

Distance: 7.5 Kms **Time:** 8 Minutes

- **Morning:** It's time to get ready for your road-trip, and the first step is to pick up your campervan from our depot in Kewdale. We recommend taking the time to stop in at Teeter Bakery and grab one of their buttery croissants and a coffee, as you also need to fuel yourself during your trip.
- **Afternoon:** While you are out and about in Perth, why not visit the Perth City Centre. You can grab some essentials and fill up your campervan with all your favourite road-trip snacks while soaking up the city vibe.
- **Evening:** It's time to enjoy some dinner before hitting the road the next day, so why not treat yourself to dinner at Balthazar.
- **Where to stay:** Discovery Holiday Park/Perth Tourist Caravan Park. Unit 39/186 Hale Road, Forrestfield WA 6058.

Day 3: Margaret River

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Morning:** To start your day off with a bang, we recommend taking a quad bike tour of Margaret River. The EcoAdventures tour will take you through the stunning Boranup Forest on fully electric quad bikes, allowing you to hear the beauty of the forest while riding along.
- **Afternoon:** The afternoon is the perfect time to catch a wave at Gas Bay, the exposed reef break that has reliable surf, especially in the summer months.
- **Evening:** If you are looking for an unforgettable way to round out this day, a whale watching tour is a must. Getting to see the whales breach and play is one of Margaret Rivers most magical experiences.
- **Where to stay:** Margaret River Tourist Park. 44 Station Road, Margaret River WA 6285.

Day 4: Margaret River to Albany

Distance: 344 Kms **Time:** 4 Hours 5 Minutes

- **Morning:** Before saying farewell to Margaret River, it's worth stopping in at The Good Egg for one of their all-day breakfasts.
- **Afternoon:** After such a hearty breakfast you might need to take the time to stretch your legs. Meelup Beach is the perfect spot for this, with its white sand and turquoise water it is a spot worthy of a space on your Instagram feed.
- **Evening:** A great way to finish the day is take a sunset stroll along Little Beach.
- **Where to stay:** Tasman Holiday parks – Albany. 22 Wellington Street, Centennial Park WA 6330.

Day 5: Albany

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Morning:** The best way to begin the day is with a visit to the Valley of the Giants Treetop Walk. Where you will wander along a 600-meter-long suspended walkway high up in the canopy of ancient tingle trees.
- **Afternoon:** Albany sits in the heart of the Great Southern Wine Region, renowned for its cool-climate wines like chardonnay, riesling, and pinot noir. Stop in at Singlefile Wines for a tasting, then linger over a relaxed lunch paired with a glass of the region's best.
- **Evening:** Wrap up the day at the serene Greens Pool, a sheltered swimming spot framed by giant granite boulders, turquoise-green water, and soft white sand. Perfect for a late swim or a peaceful stroll.
- **Where to stay:** Tasman Holiday parks – Albany. 22 Wellington Street, Centennial Park WA 6330.

Day 6: Albany to Middleton

Distance: 5.9 Kms **Time:** 9 Minutes

- **Morning:** A perfect time to visit two of Albany's most dramatic coastal landmarks, The Gap and Natural Bridge.
- **Afternoon:** Continue your day with a trip to the Granite Skywalk. The hike takes you through towering Karri and Marri forests.
- **Evening:** After a day out in nature a cosy evening resting in your motorhome might be just the thing you need to recover.
- **Where to stay:** BIG 4 Middleton Beach Holiday Park. 28 Flinders Parade, Middleton Beach WA 6330. Powered Site.

Day 7: Middleton to Ravensthorpe

Distance: 305 Kms **Time:** 3 Hours 16 Minutes

- **Morning:** Fuel up (yourself and your motorhome) as you are about to head on one of Australia's most iconic drives, the Nullarbor Plain. For this journey you will need to make sure you have plenty of water and fuel, but as we are breaking the trip up into sections and adding in a couple of overnight stays it is not as long a journey.
- **Afternoon:** It's now time to head towards our first stop, Ravensthorpe. On arrival why not treat yourself to a delicious meal at Ravy Country Kitchen.
- **Evening:** After the drive head to your campsite and enjoy all the comforts of your motorhome. This is a great opportunity to rest up before tomorrow.
- **Where to stay:** Green Haven Tourist Park, 2 Elston St, Ravensthorpe WA 6346. Powered Site.

Day 8: Ravensthorpe to Balladonia

Distance: 535 Kms **Time:** 5 Hours 40 Minutes

- **Morning:** After a hearty breakfast in the comfort of your motorhome, it is time to leave Ravensthorpe and head towards Balladonia.
- **Afternoon:** After you arrive in Balladonia, you can stretch your legs in the world's largest temperate woodland. The Great Western Woodlands is 16 hectares and boasts the title of the world's largest and healthiest intact temperate woodland.
- **Evening:** Enjoy dinner at the Balladonia Hotel Motel.
- **Where to stay:** Balladonia caravan and camping park, 22 Eyre Hwy, Balladonia WA 6443. Powered site.

Day 9: Balladonia to Mundrabilla

Distance: 402 Kms **Time:** 4 Hours 4 Minutes

- **Morning:** This morning is another great opportunity to spend a slow morning in your motorhome, enjoying a relaxing breakfast and getting ready for today's adventure.
- **Afternoon:** This afternoon you will be driving along Australia's longest and straightest road, the 147 km stretch between Balladonia and Caiguna. Be sure to stop for a photo at the famous wildlife road sign, which is a classic Nullarbor moment.
- **Evening:** End your evening at Mundrabilla Roadhouse, the perfect stop to recharge before tackling the next stretch of your road trip. Kick back with a meal at the restaurant, unwind with a drink in the bar or beer garden, and enjoy a well-earned rest before hitting the road again.
- **Where to stay:** Mundrabilla Roadhouse, Eyre Hwy, Mundrabilla WA 6443. Powered site.

Day 10: Mundrabilla to Yalata

Distance: 380 Kms **Time:** 3 Hours 55 Minutes

- **Morning:** Start the day with a hearty breakfast at Mundrabilla Roadhouse.
- **Afternoon:** Continue your journey along the Eyre Highway, each kilometre bringing you closer to your destination. Along the way, soak up the breathtaking scenery of the Great Australian Bight.
- **Evening:** End the day by reeling in a fish at the park for dinner and cook it up back at your motorhome campsite and unwind.
- **Where to stay:** Yalata Roadhouse and Caravan Park, Eyre Hwy, Yalata SA 5690. Powered site.

Day 11: Yalata

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Morning:** Spend the morning at Fowlers Bay Conservation Park, the perfect spot to reconnect with nature. Watch for whales from the cliffs, take a boat tour to meet playful sea lions and fur seals, or stretch your legs with a hike across the vast sand dunes.
- **Afternoon:** Continue the day with a round on the Nullarbor Links, the world's longest golf course. The 18-hole course has you teeing off across the outback and along rugged coastline often with kangaroos, emus, or bush turkeys lingering nearby.
- **Evening:** With supplies replenished, settle into your campsite for a relaxed evening. Cook up a simple dinner in your motorhome, then step outside and look up as the remote Nullarbor offers beautiful skies perfect for stargazing.
- **Where to stay:** Yalata Roadhouse and Caravan Park, Eyre Hwy, Yalata SA 5690. Powered site.

Day 12: Yalata to Cummins/Eyre Peninsula

Distance: 555 Kms **Time:** 5 Hours 53 Minutes

- **Morning:** Before the journey across wide open roads, take a well-earned break at the Nullarbor Roadhouse.
- **Afternoon:** Hit the highway and aim for the Salt & Soil Food Truck, a much-loved local food truck which is known for fresh seafood and great coffee.
- **Evening:** For thrill-seekers, cap off the day with a great white shark cage dive. South Australia is one of the few places in the world where you can safely come face-to-face with these incredible predators.
- **Where to stay:** Cummins Caravan & Cabin Park, 2/10 Roe St, Cummins SA 5631. Powered site.

Day 13: Cummins/Eyre Peninsula

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Morning:** Begin the day at the Whyalla Maritime Museum, which showcases naval history, BHP shipbuilding, and the region's maritime heritage. The highlight is the HMAS Whyalla, South Australia's first modern warship, now resting on dry land just two kilometres from the sea.
- **Afternoon:** Next, dive into one of the Eyre Peninsula's most unforgettable experiences swimming with sea lions. Nicknamed the "puppies of the sea," these playful, curious creatures will dart, twist, and twirl around you in the sparkling blue waters.
- **Evening:** Ease into the evening with a visit to Greenly Beach, a favourite among locals for its surf and swimming. Whether you hit the waves or simply relax on the sand, it's the perfect place to end the day by the water.
- **Where to stay:** Cummins Caravan & Cabin Park, 2/10 Roe St, Cummins SA 5631., Powered site.

Day 14: Cummins/Eyre Peninsula to Barossa Valley

Distance: 624 Kms **Time:** 6 Hours 42 Minutes

- **Morning:** Start your morning at L'Anse French Café, a much-loved local spot perfect for fuelling yourself up before hitting the road.
- **Afternoon:** Take a short detour to the Barossa Valley, world-renowned for its wines, flavours, and rich culture. If you are a keen foodie, you can take a trip over to Maggie Beer's Farm Shop in Nuriootpa.
- **Evening:** Wrap up the day by picking up a favourite bottle from one of the valley's wineries. Back at your campsite and unwind with a glass of Barossa's best.
- **Where to stay:** Discovery Parks – Barossa Valley, 1F Murray St, Tanunda SA 5352. Powered site.

Day 15: Barossa Valley to Adelaide

Distance: 74.8 Kms **Time:** 58 Minutes

- **Morning:** After all the food and wine yesterday, you might be keen for a bit of a sleep-in. And that is easy in a motorhome as there is more flexibility around things like check-out times. After a small, assuming you are not still full from yesterday, breakfast in campervan it is once again time to head out on the road.
- **Afternoon:** Spend the afternoon at Seppeltsfield Winery & Estate, enjoying tastings of whites, rosés, reds, and fortified wines. Join a behind-the-scenes tour and then grab a late lunch at the acclaimed Fino Seppeltsfield restaurant.
- **Evening:** After leaving Seppeltsfield is it time to take the drive into Adelaide itself. With a continuing theme of great food and wine, Adelaide is a great place to explore and find a hidden gem for dinner.
- **Where to stay:** Adelaide Showground Caravan Park, 38 Leader St, Wayville SA 5034. Powered site.

Day 16: Adelaide

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Morning:** Kick off the day with a visit to Adelaide Zoo, an inner-city sanctuary home to over 250 species from around the globe.
- **Afternoon:** See the city from a new perspective with an Adelaide City Kayak Tour. Paddle along the River Torrens and glide past the city's highlights, including the iconic Adelaide Oval and scenic riverbank precinct.
- **Evening:** Wrap up your time in by diving into its buzzing bar scene.
- **Where to stay:** Adelaide Showground Caravan Park, 38 Leader St, Wayville SA 5034. Powered site.

Day 17: Adelaide

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Afternoon:** Head to the bustling Adelaide Central Market, a must-visit for food lovers. Here, stalls overflow with South Australian produce, from cheeses and honey to fresh fruit, breads, and small goods alongside authentic global street food.
- **Evening:** Wrap up the day with the Adelaide Oval RoofClimb, an unforgettable twilight adventure. Scale the stadium's rooftops and historic stands for sweeping city views, catching the sunset from one of Adelaide's most spectacular vantage points.
- **Where to stay:** Adelaide Showground Caravan Park, 38 Leader St, Wayville SA 5034. Powered site.

Day 18: Adelaide to Mount Gambier

Distance: 448 Kms **Time:** 4 Hours 49 Minutes

- **Morning:** Start the day at Glenelg, Adelaide's beloved city beach. As the sun rolls, the sky explodes in shades of red, orange, and gold.
- **Afternoon:** After your morning stroll, head into Adelaide's CBD and enjoy a late lunch. With endless cafés, restaurants, and eateries to choose from.
- **Evening:** As the sun sets, take a peaceful stroll along the shoreline to Cape Banks Lighthouse at Carpenter Rocks.
- **Where to stay:** Pine Country Caravan Park, 2/16 Kilsby Rd, Moorak SA 5291. Powered site.

Day 19: Mount Gambier

Distance: 0 Kms **Time:** 0 Minutes

- **Morning:** Kick off your day with a tour of the ancient Tantanoola Cave and Conservation Park. Inside, you'll find striking stalactites, stalagmites, shells, and fossils, while a short 500m hike up the cliff offers panoramic views of the surrounding forest and its rich wildlife.
- **Afternoon:** Cool off at the Little Blue Lake, a natural water-filled sinkhole loved by both locals and tourists. With steps and a floating pontoon for easy access, it's the perfect spot for a refreshing swim in crystal-clear water.
- **Evening:** Round out the day by venturing into Mount Gambier's dormant volcano to explore its famous crater lakes. The lakes are framed by dramatic volcanic walls, scenic trails, and a surrounding conservation park.
- **Where to stay:** Pine Country Caravan Park, 2/16 Kilsby Rd, Moorak SA 5291. Powered site.

Day 20: Mount Gambier to Grampians

Distance: 184 Kms **Time:** 2 Hours 16 Minutes

- **Morning:** On arrival, enjoy a relaxed stroll through the city centre. Mount Gambier is the retail hub of the region, with hidden gems.
- **Afternoon:** After a morning strolling through the city centre, head for Livefast Café, then make sure your motorhome is fuelled and stocked before hitting the road to Mount William.
- **Evening:** Finish the day with a climb to Mount William, the park's highest peak.
- **Where to stay:** Breeze Holiday Parks, 26 School Rd, Halls Gap VIC 338. Powered site.

Day 22: Apollo Bay to The Great Ocean Road

Distance: 80.6 Kms **Time:** 1 Hour 15 Minutes

- **Morning:** Continue your journey to the laid-back coastal town of Johanna, near Apollo Bay. Known for its wide-open beaches, and peaceful atmosphere.
- **Afternoon:** It would be a crime to come all this way and not take the time to visit one of the iconic natural wonders of the world, the 12 Apostles.
- **Evening:** After a day of exploring, make your way to your campsite and settle in for a relaxed evening.
- **Where to stay:** Princetown Recreation Reserve, 93 Old Coach Rd, Princetown VIC 3269. Powered site.

Day 21: Grampians to Apollo Bay

Distance: 362 Kms **Time:** 4 Hours 59 Minutes

- **Morning:** Continue your road trip with a scenic drive into Grampians National Park. After the journey, take a break to refuel and whip up a relaxed brunch in your motorhome, surrounded by nature.
- **Afternoon:** Visit the iconic MacKenzie Falls, one of Victoria's largest waterfalls, flowing year-round. From Bluff Lookout, enjoy sweeping views of the gorge and the MacKenzie River as it cascades dramatically through the landscape.
- **Evening:** As the day winds down, make your way to Apollo Bay to catch a spectacular sunset. After exploring the harbour and beach, settle into one of the local eateries for a delicious dinner. It's the perfect way to wrap up a day on the Great Ocean Road.
- **Where to stay:** BIG4 Apollo Bay Pisces Holiday Park, 311 Great Ocean Rd, Apollo Bay VIC 3233. Powered site.

Day 23: The Great Ocean Road to Melbourne

Distance: 229 Kms **Time:** 2 Hours 52 Minutes

- **Morning:** Start your day with breakfast made right in your fully equipped GoCheap Campervan. Once you're fuelled up, hit the road and begin the next leg of your journey along the world-famous Great Ocean Road.
- **Afternoon:** Spend the afternoon wandering through the iconic Queen Victoria Market. Browse fresh produce, artisan goods, quirky souvenirs, and international street food.
- **Evening:** As evening falls, head to the historic Old Melbourne Gaol for the spine-chilling Hangman's Night Tour. This immersive experience takes you through shadowy corridors, eerie cells and bone-chilling tales of the prison's grisly past.

So why not explore the city and find one of the many cafes to indulge in a morning brew and a bite to eat.
- **Afternoon:** Just opposite Federation Square in the heart of Melbourne lies the iconic Hosier Lane, the iconic cobblestone laneway known globally for its ever-changing street art and graffiti. As it is a free-to-paint zone you can often see an artist at work and get to see the creative process first hand.
